



**Health Care Legislation Affecting Low-Income Consumers as of June 12, 2019**

All bills moving forward this year are in the second house now and must go through policy committees by July 10th for fiscal bills or July 12th for non-fiscal bills. Several bills were held in appropriations in the first house and will not continue this year. Following is a summary of bills in the Legislature that affect the health of low-income Californians.

AB 744	Aguiar-Curry	Health care coverage: telehealth.	Senate Health	This bill would delete provisions that require Medi-Cal patients receiving telehealth services be notified of the right to receive interactive communication with a distant specialist physician, optometrist, or dentist.

Senate Health	This bill would require DHCS to convene a stakeholder workgroup to develop standard forms to be used by county mental health plan providers for performing the intake of, the assessment of, and the treatment planning for children on Medi-Cal who are eligible for specialty mental health services. AB 1494	Aguiar-Curry	Medi-Cal: telehealth: state of emergency.	Senate	This bill would allow for telehealth in states of emergency if federal financial participation is available.

Senate	This bill would impose additional requirements on Medi-Cal managed care plans that are unable to meet network adequacy standards; require the department to conduct preventative outreach and education for Medi-Cal enrollees; and increase the department's sanction authority against plans.	
SB 29	Durazo	Medi-Cal: eligibility.	Assembly Health	This bill would expand full-scope Medi-Cal to all income-eligible adults regardless of immigration status, age 19 through 25, age 65 and above, and phase-in for other populations.	Support
SB 66	Atkins	Medi-Cal: federally qualified health center and rural health clinic services.	Assembly Health	This bill would allow FQHC and RHCs to bill Medi-Cal two visits if a patient is provided mental health services on the same day they receive other services.	Support

Assembly Health	This bill would require DHCS to implement and administer the California Community Transitions program, which provides funding for low-income people with disabilities to transition from skilled nursing facilities back into homes of their own. SB 289	Archuleta	Medi-Cal: home- and community-based services: military.	Assembly Health	Keeps family members of a military service member on the HCBS waitlist while the member is deployed as long as they retain California residence.	
SB 361	Mitchell	Medi-Cal: Health Home Program.	Assembly Health	This bill would remove restrictions around State funding and termination of Health Home Program after two years to eliminate perception that program is "pilot" and ensure chronically homeless individuals are targeted through partnership with homeless systems, enhanced outreach rate, and data collection.
