



Health Care Legislation Affecting Low-Income Consumers as of July 10, 2019

All bills moving forward this year are in the second house now and must go through policy committees by July 10th for fiscal bills or July 12th for non-fiscal bills before the Legislature recesses for a month. The Legislature will reconvene on August 12. Following is a summary of bills in the Legislature that affect the health of low-income Californians.

AB 744	Aguiar-Curry	Health care coverage: telehealth.	Senate Appropriations	This bill would require health care contracts to specify that the plan is required to reimburse the provider for the diagnosis, consultation, or treatment delivered through telehealth and cover health care delivered through telehealth on the same basis and to the same extent as in-person diagnosis, consultation, or treatment.

Senate Appropriations	This bill would require DHCS to convene a stakeholder workgroup to develop standard forms to be used by county mental health plan providers for performing the intake of, the assessment of, and the treatment planning for children on Medi-Cal who are eligible for specialty mental health services.	Support
AB 914	Holden	Medi-Cal: inmates: eligibility.	Senate Appropriations	Requires suspension of Medi-Cal eligibility while incarcerated (instead of termination after a year) for individuals under age 26 and requires DHCS to develop a simplified annual redetermination for these individuals.	Support
AB 1004	McCarty	Developmental screening services.	Senate Appropriations	This bill would require screening services under the EPSDT program include developmental screening services for individuals zero to 3 years of age and be in compliance with the periodicity schedule and screening tools that are established by the Bright Futures/American Academy of Pediatrics Recommendations for Preventive Pediatric Health Care.	

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AB 1042	Wood	Medi-Cal: beneficiary maintenance needs; home upkeep allowances; transitional needs funds.	Senate Health	Increases the allowed home upkeep allowance and transitional needs fund for persons likely to leave nursing home care.	Support
AB 1088	Wood	Medi-Cal: eligibility.	Senate Health	Stops beneficiaries from bouncing between free and share-of-cost Medi-Cal by treating Part B premium deductions the same for applicants as for recipients. Co-sponsors: Justice in Aging & Disability Rights CA	Co-Sponsor
AB 1494	Aguiar-Curry	Medi-Cal: telehealth: state of emergency.	Senate Health	This bill would allow for telehealth in states of emergency if federal financial participation is available.	
AB 1642	Wood	Medi-Cal: managed care plans.	Senate Health	This bill would impose additional requirements on Medi-Cal managed care plans that are unable to meet network adequacy standards; require the department to conduct preventative outreach and education for Medi-Cal enrollees; and increase the department's sanction authority against plans. SB 29	Durazo	Medi-Cal: eligibility.	Assembly Appropriations	This bill would expand full-scope Medi-Cal to all income-eligible adults regardless of immigration status, age 65 and above.	Support
SB 66	Atkins	Medi-Cal: federally qualified health center and rural health clinic services.	Assembly Appropriations	This bill would allow FQHC and RHCs to bill Medi-Cal two visits if a patient is provided mental health services on the same day they receive other services.	Support
SB 214	Dodd	Medi-Cal: California Community Transitions program.	Assembly Appropriations	This bill would require DHCS to implement and administer the California Community Transitions program, which provides funding for low-income people with disabilities to transition from skilled nursing facilities back into homes of their own.	Support
SB 289	Archuleta	Medi-Cal: home- and community-based services: military.	Assembly Veterans Affairs	Allows family members of a military service member to return to their place on the HCBS waitlist when regaining their California residency.	
SB 361	Mitchell	Medi-Cal: Health Homes Program.	Assembly Appropriations	This bill would remove restrictions around State funding and termination of Health Home Program after two years to eliminate perception that program is "pilot" and ensure chronically homeless individuals are targeted through partnership with homeless systems, enhanced outreach rate, and data collection. Cosponsors: Corporation for Supportive Housing, Housing California, and Western Center.	Co-Sponsor
SB 503	Pan	Medi-Cal: managed care plan: subcontracts.	Assembly Appropriations	This bill would align state sanction authority with federal sanction authority; codify language that makes clear health plan's responsibility, regardless of subcontracting; require plans to conduct annual audits of delegated entities and report on data of delegated entities. Co-sponsors: National Health Law Program and WCLP.	Co-Sponsor

Assembly Appropriations	This bill would include asthma preventive services as a covered Medi-Cal benefit and require DHCS to develop with external stakeholders a coverage policy consistent with specified federal and clinically appropriate guidelines. Senate Appropriations	This bill would strengthen referral, care coordination, continuity of care, and dispute resolution process between Medi-Cal plans and county mental health plans.
