



Health Care Legislation Affecting Low-Income Consumers as of October 17, 2019

The Governor had until October 13 to sign or veto the bills. Bills that are signed are labelled "CHAPTERED." Unless otherwise noted in the bill itself, bills passed this session have an effective date of January 1, 2020. Bills labelled "2-year bill" may be acted upon next year.

AB 50	Kalra	Medi-Cal: Assisted Living Waiver program.	2-year bill	This 2-year bill would require DHCS to submit renewal request of the Assisted Living Waiver program, expanding the number of waiver slots and geographic region.	Support
AB 683	Carrillo	Medi-Cal Assets Test	2-year bill	Raises the assets limit for Non-MAGI Medi-Cal programs, simplifies exempt assets, and eliminates the assets test for Medicare Savings Programs	Co-Sponsor
AB 744	Aguiar-Curry	Health care coverage: telehealth.	CHAPTERED	This bill would require health care contracts to specify that the plan is required to reimburse the provider for the diagnosis, consultation, or treatment delivered through telehealth and cover health care delivered through telehealth on the same basis and to the same extent as in-person diagnosis, consultation, or treatment.	
AB 914	Holden	Medi-Cal: inmates: eligibility.	VETOED	Requires suspension of Medi-Cal eligibility while incarcerated (instead of termination after a year) for individuals under age 26 and requires DHCS to develop a simplified annual redetermination for these individuals.	Support
AB 1004	McCarty	Developmental screening services.	CHAPTERED	This bill would require screening services under the EPSDT program include developmental screening services for individuals zero to 3 years of age and be in compliance with the periodicity schedule and screening tools that are established by the Bright Futures/American Academy of Pediatrics Recommendations for Preventive Pediatric Health Care.	
AB 1088	Wood	Medi-Cal: eligibility.	CHAPTERED	Stops beneficiaries from bouncing between free and share-of-cost Medi-Cal by treating Part B premium deductions the same for applicants as for recipients. Co-sponsors: Justice in Aging & Disability Rights CA	Co-Sponsor
AB 1494	Aguiar-Curry	Medi-Cal: telehealth: state of emergency.	CHAPTERED	This bill would allow for telehealth in states of emergency if federal financial participation is available.	
AB 1642	Wood	Medi-Cal: managed care plans.	CHAPTERED	This bill would impose additional requirements on Medi-Cal managed care plans that are unable to meet network adequacy standards and increase the department's sanction authority against plans.	Support
SB 29	Durazo	Medi-Cal: eligibility.	2-year bill	This 2-year bill would expand full-scope Medi-Cal to all income-eligible adults regardless of immigration status, age 65 and above.	Support

SB 66	Atkins	Medi-Cal: federally qualified health center and rural health clinic services.	2-year bill	This 2-year bill would allow FQHC and RHCs to bill Medi-Cal two visits if a patient is provided mental health services on the same day they receive other services.	Support
SB 214	Dodd	Medi-Cal: California Community Transitions program.	2-year bill	This 2-year bill would require DHCS to implement and administer the California Community Transitions program, which provides funding for low-income people with disabilities to transition from skilled nursing facilities back into homes of their own.	Support
SB 289	Archuleta	Medi-Cal: home- and community-based services: military.	CHAPTERED	Allows family members of a military service member to return to their place on the HCBS waitlist when regaining their California residency.	
SB 361	Mitchell	Medi-Cal: Health Homes Program.	2-year bill	This 2-year bill would remove restrictions around State funding and termination of Health Home Program after two years to eliminate perception that program is “pilot” and ensure chronically homeless individuals are targeted through partnership with homeless systems, enhanced outreach rate, and data collection. Cosponsors: Corporation for Supportive Housing, Housing California, and Western Center.	Co-Sponsor
SB 503	Pan	Medi-Cal: managed care plan: subcontracts.	VETOED	This bill would require plans to conduct annual audits of delegated entities and report on data of delegated entities and codify language that makes clear health plan's responsibility, regardless of subcontracting. Co-sponsors: National Health Law Program and WCLP.	Co-Sponsor

AB 166	Gabriel	Medi-Cal: violence preventive services.	VETOED	This bill would require DHCS to establish a violence intervention pilot program for eligible Medi-Cal enrollees.	
AB 678	Flora	Medi-Cal: podiatric services.	CHAPTERED	This bill would subject a podiatrist providing services to the same Medi-Cal prior authorization and billing polices as required for a physician.	Support
AB 848	Gray	Medi-Cal: covered benefits: continuous glucose monitors.	VETOED	This bill would add continuous glucose monitors and related supplies required for use with those monitors as a Medi-Cal when medically necessary.	Support
SB 154	Pan	Medi-Cal: restorative dental services.	VETOED	This bill would add silver diamine fluoride as a caries arresting agent as a covered Medi-Cal benefit.	
SB 207	Hurtado	Medi-Cal: asthma preventive services.	2-year bill	This 2-year bill would include asthma preventive services as a covered Medi-Cal benefit and require DHCS to develop with external stakeholders a coverage policy consistent with specified federal and clinically appropriate guidelines. AB 1309	Bauer-Kahan	Health care coverage: enrollment periods.	CHAPTERED	Extends the Covered California open enrollment period by two weeks back to January 31st.	Support

SB 260	Hurtado	Automatic health care coverage enrollment.	CHAPTERED	Allows Covered California to automatically enroll people losing Medi-Cal/MCAP/CCHIP and reach out to others losing health coverage. Bill will be implemented in 2021.	Co-Sponsor

SB 165	Atkins	Medical interpretation services.	CHAPTERED	Extends the medical interpretation pilot project for Medi-Cal.	Support
SB 464	Mitchell	California Dignity in Pregnancy and Childbirth Act.	CHAPTERED	Requires implicit bias training for all perinatal providers and improved data collection in order to reduce the maternal mortality disparity between black women and other women in California.	Co-Sponsor

AB 598	Bloom	Hearing aids: minors.	2-year bill	This bill would require health plans to cover hearing aids (up to \$3,000) for children.

AB 731	Kalra	Health care coverage: rate review.	CHAPTERED	Applies the same transparency requirements for rate hikes for large group plans as for small group plans.	Support
SB 343	Pan	Health care data disclosure.	CHAPTERED	Requires Kaiser to file the same information regarding rates and costs as other health plans and hospitals.	Support

AB 1611	Chiu	Emergency Medical Services: costs	2-year bill	Prohibits hospitals from charging insured individuals more in out-of-pocket costs than they would pay for contracted services in an emergency and creates a dispute resolution process for the hospital and health plan.	Support
SB 639	Mitchell	Medical services: credit or loan.	CHAPTERED	Prohibits medical providers from signing patients up for medical credit cards with deferred interest provisions along with other consumer protections to ensure Medi-Cal recipients and others aren't wrongly signed up for medical credit cards. AB 512	Ting	Medi-Cal: specialty mental health services.	VETOED	This bill would require county mental health plans to set forward-looking goals in their cultural competence plans and require DHCS to annually review and monitor their progress.	Support
AB 826	Reyes	Medi-Cal: specialty mental health services: foster youth.	2-year bill	This 2-year bill would require HHS agency in order to facilitate the receipt of medically necessary specialty mental health services by a foster youth who is placed in a short-term residential therapeutic program outside of their original county, to coordinate with DHCS and DSS to issue policy guidance concerning the determination of the county of responsibility, in consultation with stakeholders.	
AB 1175	Wood	Medi-Cal: mental health services.	VETOED	This bill would strengthen care coordination and the dispute resolution process between Medi-Cal health plans and county mental health plans. Cosponsors: NHeLP and Western Center.	Co-Sponsor
SB 10	Beall	Mental health services: peer support specialist certification.	VETOED	This bill would establish a Peer Support Specialist Certification Program to be administered by DHCS.	Support

AB 204	Wood	Hospitals: community benefits plan reporting.	CHAPTERED	Allows OSHPD to fine hospitals that fail to report their community benefits or methodology for determining said benefits.	
AB 824	Wood	Business: preserving access to affordable drugs.	CHAPTERED	Adds agreements by drug manufacturers to keep generics off the market to the Unfair Business Practices Act.	Support
AB 875	Wicks	Pupil health: in-school support services.	2-year bill	This 2-year bill, known as the Healthy Start Support Services for Children Act, would award grants to local educational agencies or consortia to fund programs in schools that provide support services, which include case-managed health, mental health, social, and academic support services, to eligible pupils and their families.	
ACR 1	Bonta	Immigration: public charges.	CHAPTERED	Condemns the proposed public charge regulations.	Support

SB 24	Leyva	Public health: public university student health centers: abortion by medication techniques.	CHAPTERED	Requires CalStates and UCs to offer abortion by medication services.	Support
SB 695	Portantino	Special education: individualized education programs: translation services.	VETOED	This bill would require the local educational agency to provide parents whose native language is not English with timely access to a translation of their child's individualized education plan (IEP).	Support
