

Executive Order - Summary

Wednesday, June 17, 2020

On Wednesday, June 17, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom issued Executive Order (EO) 69 that extended the end-date for previously issued EOs. Below is a list of those EO's and a summary of what their extension meant.

Paragraph 2 is extended for an additional 60 days from the date of this Order.
Paragraph 2 states through June 17, 2020, any month or partial month where CalWORKs is received shall not be counted in the 48-month time limit set in the welfare and institutions code section 11454. Any waiver of this time limit will not be applied if it exceeds the federal time limit set in the federal code of regulations title 45 section 264.1.

Paragraph 8, is extended for an additional 60 days from the date of this order.
Paragraph 8 states that the Department of Social Services may allow any state monthly face to face caseworker visitation requirement to be accomplished through video conferencing instead of in person contact.

Paragraph 1, is further extended for an additional 60 days.
Paragraph 1 states the timeframe set in the business and professions code Division 4, Part 1, Chapter 3, Article 2(Section 10150, et seq) concerning real estate broker licenses are extended for 60 days. The timeframe in the business and professions code Division 4, Part 1, Chapter 3, Article 4(Section 10200, et seq) related to payment of real estate license application and renewal fees are also extended for 60 days.

Paragraph 2, is further extended for an additional 60 days.
Paragraph 2 states the timeframe set in the Business and Professions code Division 4, Part 1, Chapter 3, Article 2.5(Section 10170, et seq) relating to continuing education requirements for real estate licences is extended for 60 days.

Paragraph 3, is further extended for an additional 60 days.



Paragraph 3 states the deadlines issued by the Real Estate Commissioner pursuant to Business and Professions code, Division 4, Part 1, are hereby extended for a period of 60 days.

Paragraph 15, is extended for an additional 60 days from the date of this Order.
Paragraph 15 states the restrictions for commercial activities in safety roadside rest areas are suspended for a period of 60 days to allow commercially licensed food trucks to sell food in designated safety roadside areas in compliance with a temporary permit issued by Caltrans. Caltrans is authorized to issue temporary permits to food trucks to sell food in designated safety areas.

Paragraph 7, is extended for an additional 60 days from the date of this Order.
Paragraph 7 states State eligibility criteria for payments to non-minor dependents living in or requesting approval of a Supervised Independent Living placement requiring in person or face to face meetings are suspended.

is withdrawn and superseded by the following text: State extended foster care eligibility for all youth entering or reentering extended foster care requiring any physical, in-person, face-to-face application, meetings, visits, and signature requirements, as required by Welfare and Institutions Code sections 388, 388.1, 11400, and 11403 and accompanying rules or regulations, are suspended for an additional 60 days from the date of this Order.

Paragraph 10, is extended for an additional 60 days from the date of this Order.
Paragraph 10 states visitation requirements contained in section 11405 of the Welfare and Institutions Code are suspended.

Paragraph 12, is extended for an additional 60 days from the date of this Order.
Paragraph 12 states the provisions for an investigation of a proposed independent adoption, timelines for the report, and accompanying rules/ regulations are suspended.

Paragraph 13, is extended for an additional 60 days from the date of this Order.



Paragraph 13 states physical in person certification functions except for investigations regarding a serious risk to the health and safety of the person in care required for out of state group homes within the Department of Social Services' jurisdiction are suspended.

Paragraph 3, is extended for an additional 60 days from the date of this Order.

Paragraph 3 states the timeframe set forth in the vehicle code section 4156 subdivision (b) pertaining to temporary permits is suspended for 60 days. This suspension is applicable to temporary permits that expired on or after March 4, 2020, or will expire within 60 days from the date of this Order.

Paragraph 1, is extended for an additional 60 days from the date of this Order.

Paragraph 1 states pregnant CalWORKs applicants who do not have another needy child in the family can satisfy the requirement to provide medical verification of pregnancy by means of a sworn statement, or verbal attestation that they are pregnant. Medical verification of pregnancy must be submitted within 30 working days following submittal of the sworn statement or verbal attestation for benefits to continue.

Paragraph 2, is extended for an additional 60 days from the date of this Order

Paragraph 2 states Welfare and Institutions Code section 10831 are suspended where they require the Department of Social Services to implement any identity verification method for CalWORKs applicants who are unable to present photo identification in person.

Paragraph 3, is extended for an additional 60 days from the date of this Order.

Paragraph 3 states the "affirmation setting forth [an applicant's] belief that [the applicant] meets specific conditions of eligibility" required by section 11054 need not be in writing: County Welfare Departments may accept a CalWORKs applicant's oral affirmation of belief if the County Welfare Department is unable to accept, or the applicant is unable to provide, a physical signature.

Paragraph 4, is extended for an additional 60 days from the date of this Order.
Paragraph 4 states Welfare and Institutions Code section 11052.5 is suspended to the extent that it requires CalWORKs applicants to undergo an interview before being granted public assistance if a County Welfare Department has verified the identity of the applicant and has completed all other mandatory verifications.
