

## Health Care Legislation Affecting Low-Income Consumers as of June 16, 2021

Following is a summary of bills in the Legislature that affect the health of low-income Californians. June 4 was the deadline for bills to pass out of their house of origin unless they became 2-year bills. Multiple bills were held in Appropriations, and those designated as 2-year bills will advance next year and those marked HELD will not be moving forward in the 2021-22 legislative session. Finally, both houses agreed that each author could only advance 12 bills in the second house this year meaning even more bills were designated as 2-year bills.
